Graduate Research Fellowships Available

Auburn University invites applications for two graduate student fellowships in the Department of Aerospace Engineering with a stipend of \$24,000/year beginning in the fall of 2007. Applicants must have a minimum grade point average of 3.2 in Aerospace Engineering or a closely related discipline and combined Quantitative and Verbal scores on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) of at least 1,200. Preference will be given to students applying to the Ph.D. program, but applicants at the Masters level will also be considered. The successful fellowship recipient will be expected to identify a graduate faculty advisor by the end of the fall 2007 semester in one of the department's current research areas.

The Aerospace Engineering Department at Auburn University has a rich history and an active, supportive, and very successful alumni base including astronauts, high-ranking personnel in a variety of private firms and government agencies, and university professors. The department is currently undergoing a period of growth and revitalization, with four of the ten current faculty members having been hired within the last four years.
