Part four: How will we get there from here? A realistic look at the changes that need to be made. Not just window dressing, but changes that will keep the surveyor relevant in the future. Changes needed in the next twenty to fifty years in education, licensure, and technology. Included in this segment will be Milton's bold fifty year plan! If implemented, it will return the surveyor to the status once enjoyed.

This workshop should be of direct interest to those people who practice surveying, but also those who work in the civil engineering field, including county engineers, city engineers, public works officials, transportation engineers, DOT personnel, Federal employees, contractors, and consultants.

He is currently teaching professional development classes for Auburn University at off-campus locations, as well as, basic and advanced surveying for the Alabama Department of Transportation.
