

Visual Display

Overview

This year for the ASCE Southeastern Regional Competition, we thought that it would be an excellent opportunity to honor each school's civil engineering department by creating a scrapbook outlining the excellence and success of your program.

Objective

Using your teams creative skills create a historic time-line with the use of a scrapbook, of your school's civil engineering department. Have fun digging into the past and be creative!

Eligibility

Any undergraduate civil engineering student that is involved with their ASCE chapter is welcome to participate. There is no limit on the number of students involved; however no "professional" help is to be sought to complete the scrapbook.

Logistics

All work to be completed before arrival. Scrapbooks will be returned at the end of the competition.

Submittals

No early submittals are necessary. Scrapbook must be turned in at the assigned time during competition.

Materials

- One (1) twelve by twelve (12"x12") scrapbook (Page Limit)
- Exterior of the scrapbook is to be determined by the school
- 10 page limit (may use less if desired), may use front and back (20 total visible surfaces may be used)
- Photos, Newspaper clippings, Articles, etc. may be used
- Paper choice and accents used is not limited

Execution

- Scrapbook may be organized however the school decides, but two (2) items are mandatory:
 - 1. The school must designate the front side of the first page for a letter to be written from the school's department chair.
 - 2. The last page (either front or back side) must be designated for the signatures of all active ASCE students / alumni who participate in ongoing chapter activities.
- There are no limitations on the way historic information is portrayed within the scrapbook.
- The focus should be on the past 40-50 years of your school's civil engineering department and ASCE chapter.

Judging

There will be three judges for this event judging on display of history, creativity, and meeting all requirements. Each judge will have a separate score sheet, and the average score for each team will be the score given. In the event of a tie of the average score for two teams, the judges will collectively decide upon the winner.

Scoring

15 points total will be distributed at the discretion of each judge based on the following areas:

- Display of History
- Creativity and use of materials
- Letter from Department Chair
- Signed page of ASCE Participants

The average of the three (3) judges' scores, rounded to the nearest half (0.5) point, will be the score given to each team.
