

# Application for Assistance through the Safety Technical Assistance Program for Alabama Cities and Counties (STACC)



The Safety Technical Assistance Program for Alabama Cities and Counties (STACC) is funded by the Federal Highway Administration through the Alabama Department of Transportation. The mission of the program is to provide road safety technical assistance to Alabama's cities and counties, particularly those in rural areas or with relatively small populations.

This application is the mechanism by which local governments can request technical assistance to address highway safety concerns at specific locations or corridors on locally maintained roadways in their jurisdictions or to request related training. STACC assistance can include, but is not limited to, network screening, diagnosing safety problems, recommending countermeasures, and supporting road safety reviews. Please allow two weeks for a response regarding whether the request will be supported through STACC.
