Pollution of rivers, lakes, & reservoirs


Polling the population on pollution

Extinction of plant & animal species	40%
Climate change	39%
Loss of tropical rain forests	39%
Air pollution	38%

- Broad concern about water resources across the political spectrum





Early ALDOT attempt at post-construction stormwater management (rural Lauderdale County, near AL-TN line)


One citizen's feedback

- **Educated** citizen on ALDOT's green infrastructure goals... focused on **citizen's interests** (e.g., offsetting development impacts)





- Address the issue as urgency dictates

- Explain honestly the action(s) taken (or not taken)
- **Educate** respectfully... with a focus on <u>public</u> <u>priorities</u>
