This workshop will provide a thorough introduction to road safety and the process by which safety performance of the surface transportation system is analyzed and improved. The workshop begins with an overview of the history of road safety and current efforts to impact safety performance, including the concept of safety culture and the Safe System Approach. The next module presents practical tools to quantify and analyze safety performance, supported by an understanding of crash data. Methods to identify and diagnose safety issues are presented and followed by tools and treatments, or countermeasures, to address the issues identified. Finally, a focus on special topics, such as vulnerable road users and roadway departures, concludes the workshop. Several example scenarios will be provided and worked through in small groups throughout the day.

This workshop should be of interest to transportation professionals whose job duties impact road safety performance.

Rod E. Turochy is the James M. Hunnicutt Professor of Traffic Engineering in the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering at Auburn University, where he has been since January 2002. He also serves as the Associate Director for Outreach for the Auburn University Transportation Research Institute. He earned his bachelors and master's degrees at Virginia Tech and a Ph.D. at the University of Virginia, all in civil engineering. Dr. Turochy also has four years of work experience with the Virginia Department of Transportation; in his last role with VDOT, he managed work zone safety for the Salem District. He is a licensed engineer in Alabama and Virginia. He has conducted research and taught workshops on a variety of transportation safety topics over the years, with a particular focus on pedestrian safety, roadway departures, and work zone safety.
